V. Guest Presentation - E.O. Smith High School, Mr. Bruce Silva, Superintendent & Mr. Louis DeLoreto, Principal

"We are proud of our designated high schools, Bolton, E.O. Smith and Windham Tech for their rigorous and student-centered programs."

Douglas Melody-Guidance Director, Louis DeLoreto-Principal and Bruce Silva-Superintendent attended the meeting to provide an overview of the opportunities available at E.O. Smith High School. E.O. Smith has a wealth of offerings in academics, the arts, athletics and leadership opportunities. Columbia's

students are welcomed and accepted as part of the E.O. Smith community. The location offers access to coursework and opportunities at the University of Connecticut.

L. Napolitano thanked everyone for their hard work.

K. Tolsdorf wants the teachers to know they are highly valued and she commended everyone on how cooperatively the agreement was reached. MOTION CARRIES 7:0.

VIII. Presentation – Long-Range Planning Options and Next Steps – Mr. Fearon

"We purposefully plan to meet future challenges."

L. Fearon described several long range planning options. Contracts with our existing high school choices are due to end in 2022 and decisions would need to be reached by 2021 in order to extend or enter into new contracts.

If the option of regionalization is pursued it requires a 2 year lead in time due to a strict statutory process. There are 3 regionalized districts in our area – RHAM, Region 19 and Region 11. (Region 11 is

currently considering dissolving.) If we were to regionalize with another district the process would need to include acceptances from all of towns who are part of the region in order to expand the region and would also require the approval by the Town of Columbia to join the region.

K. Tolsdorf questioned the option of partnering at the middle school level.

L. Fearon provided materials which include 5 range of options for consideration. L. Fearon has been contacted by several districts who are interested in partnering with Columbia on a tuition basis. Currently there are no towns in our area seeking to create a new region. The option of tuition based enrollment with other towns becomes less cost effective due to fee based additional services and transportation costs.

C. Lent agreed with the timeline and the Board's goal will be to review the options and be ready to present a proposal to the Town by May of 2017.

L. Fearon indicated the number of Columbia high school students have increased slightly over projections. He suggested considering a new demographic study. The current study provides projections through 2023 but is not especially accurate after 2019.

XI. Superintendent's Report

- *Breakfast Program Update – Preliminary numbers* – L. Fearon reported the breakfast program is averaging between 40-50 breakfasts per day since its availability which began October 17, 2016. So far 409 breakfasts have been served. The majority of students participating are students coming off the buses. An updated report will be available at the December meeting.
- *Update on Bus Contract* –A proposal dated 11/7/16 from John Hipshire of M&J Bus, Inc. was received. The 5 year proposal outlines an initial increase of 5.2% for the first year then 3.1% for subsequent years. L. Fearon plans to review the proposal with the Eastconn consultant and also compare the proposal with other districts. He noted M&J drivers are familiar with the community and there is a great lead driver in place who communicates well with us.
- *CAPSS Awards Night* – The CAPSS awards ceremony was held Nov. 2nd at RHAM High School. Local area superintendents celebrated 6th, 8th, and 12th graders who were scholar leaders. Our 4 honorees

were Jack Dooley, Katie Burns, Jacob Tigeleiro, Maddy Hughes. They will be invited to the December meeting. Board members congratulated the honorees.
