Prevention Programs



AHM's Prevention Programming promotes awareness of and education about substance and alcohol use among our youth with initiatives designed to reduce occurrence. AHM's Coalition

for a Healthy & Empowered Community (AHM CHEC) and its youth alliance, SOAR Youth Leadership Group, work towards this goal through healthy lifestyle activities and events in the community and in the schools.

AHM CHEC is made up of RHAM Middle School and RHAM High School administrators, town leaders, parents, business owners, and community members, with the focus to incorporate increased community wellness with an emphasis on helping to keep youth alcohol and drug free.

Project Graduation Event 2024 - Friday, June 14th

Project Graduation is the all-night, substance-free celebration that occurs on the night of graduation. Planning is well under way for this year's event for RHAM's "Class of 2024". Parents of RHAM Juniors and Seniors are needed to fine-tune the event details with the AHM Project Graduation Coordinator.

Benefits of Project Graduation:

- Emphasizes making the choice not to drink alcohol or consume drugs when celebrating a special milestone
- Eliminates teen decisions about drinking or drugs on graduation night, and the entire community is assured that graduates are in a safe environment
- Ensures that every graduate has a party to attend; no one is excluded or left out for social or financial reasons
- Allows all graduates to celebrate together in one location

AHM's number one goal is to keep our graduates safe on an evening that statistically ranks as the highest in car accidents due to impairment. AHM Youth & Family Services proudly coordinates Project Graduation and has done so for over 25 years with thousands of graduates having attended this celebration.










SOAR Youth Leadership Group

Intervention Services.

School-Based Support Services

AHM provides school-based student support services for elementary, middle, and high school students. A Student Support Services Counselor (SSSC) is located within the school, and can be easily accessed by students for a variety of needs. Services include individual counseling, group counseling, risk assessment, crisis intervention, classroom/teacher support, parent support, referrals to outside services, peer mediation, and positive youth development programming.

Student Support Services Counselors are master's level therapists or school counselors who are professionals in the field of mental health. They are skilled in identifying a child's needs, collaborating with school staff and parents, and offering interventions designed to support each student's success. Our counselors are also active in the Juvenile Review Board, as well as on-going positive youth programming such as Power of Words, Peer Helpers, Freshman Orientation, Empowerment Camp, among others.

AHM Youth & Family Services was recently selected by the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving as one of only 8 non-profits to participate in a 30-month journey to develop and implement an earned income venture business plan that complements our mission and supports the financial sustainability of the organization. We are thrilled to use this extraordinary opportunity to implement AHM's Therapist Mentorship Program, which will help our clinical program grow to meet the needs of youth seeking mental health support.

Through this partnership, we have been fortunate to work alongside experts to help us create new revenue streams, which will enable us to move on a trajectory to better fulfill AHM's mission to promote and support the health and well-being of children, youth, and families in our community. At the heart of this work is an opportunity to expand our mental health clinical services to a growing list of those who need it. We are now well poised to implement this new plan and take our organization to new heights. The Social Enterprise Accelerator is provided in partnership with No Margin, No Mission, a national consulting firm dedicated to helping nonprofits increase their earned income and entrepreneurial capacity. In addition, AHM had the opportunity to work with Sara Leonard Group, who provided guidance and education for fund development.

The Hartford Foundation for Public Giving has created a matching challenge: for every dollar of start-up capital raised by AHM, the Foundation will match dollar for dollar, up to \$30,000.
