

As part of an ongoing effort to help residents feel more at ease talking about mental health concerns, AHM staff have created, as part of its Here 4 You campaign, a lending library of books on a range of mental health topics. All books have been pre-screened by staff. One library has been donated to each town, where anyone can access books on age-appropriate topics.

These mental health resource libraries include books on topics such as social and emotional learning for children, coping with anxiety, getting control over anger, controlling impulsive behavior, building self esteem, and how to speak with a child or teen about depression, anxiety, and self-harm.

Two of the primary goals of these mental health resource libraries are to help normalize for children and teens that they are not alone, and that there are resources and professionals to help get through times in life when an individual's state of mental health may feel overwhelming. Reading materials in the libraries are free, and paid for through a Directed Local Funds grant provided to AHM from the Department of Economic and Community Development, Connecticut Office of the Arts. A major proponent for this grant was Senator Cathy Osten, a longtime community mental health advocatefor AHM Youth and Family Services. A very special thanks to Senator Osten for her work in helping to make the Here 4 You grant project a reality.

There are four permanently placed mental health libraries in AHM's partner towns – Andover, Columbia, Hebron, and Marlborough. The books and guides on

mental health will range from families of pre-school age children through teens, young adults, and adults.

In Andover, the library is located in the rear of the Town Hall parking lot. Columbia's Here 4 You library is at the Murphy House, located at the Town Beach by the Recreation and Social Services offices. In Hebron, the Here 4 You Library is located on the grounds of the Douglas Library. In Marlborough, the Here 4 You Library is on the grounds of the Richmond Library.






CHORES & TASKS Programs

Lanterns Mentoring ··





The purpose of the CHORES & TASKs Programs is for teenagers to help senior citizens with chores within their home and on their property such as raking, stacking wood, weeding, dusting and vacuuming. Senior citizens 60+ years of age who are residents in the towns Andover, Hebron and Marlborough are welcome to contact their town's senior center for the application forms.

The benefits are great for both senior citizens and teenagers! Senior citizens have chores completed at no charge around their home and yard! Teenagers age 14-18 can earn \$15 per hour, earn a letter of recommendation for active involvement in the program, and learn communication, scheduling and time-management skills! A win-win!

AHM's CHOREs Program supports the towns of Andover, Hebron & Marlborough, and is coordinated by AHM Youth & Family Services. This program is funded by a grant from the NCAAA (North Central Area Agency on Aging) along with donations from Church of the Holy Family, Marlborough Congregational Church and St. Peter's Episcopal Church. Special thanks this year to Hebron's Greater Together Community Fund, and

Marlborough's Greater Together Community Fund for helping to support this program.

Teens must reside in the towns of Andover, Hebron, Marlborough or Columbia to be eligible to participate.

Who inspired you as a child?

Maybe it was a family member or friend, a teacher, or a famous person. We all have the power to influence someone, especially a child. AHM's Lanterns Mentoring Program matches children in our community with adults who are eager to listen to them, share with them, and help them develop to their highest potential. Mentoring is very effective in helping children to stay in school, avoid dangerous behaviors, and navigate the sometimes bumpy road to adulthood.

An hour of your time once a week can change a child's life! AHM Youth & Family Services has an opportunity for you to mentor a child in our local communities.

The AHM Lanterns Mentoring Program is a school-based model. Mentors and students meet once a week for one hour (usually during lunch and recess) in the six schools in the towns of Andover, Hebron and Marlborough. The mentoring pairs eat lunch together, play games, do crafts, and take walks outside. They form important friendships that inspire children to be the best they can be. Youth who are matched with a mentor demonstrate improved academic performance, improved peer/family relationships, increased communication skills, decreased drug use, and improved school attendance.

Mentors are trained, supported, and provided with ideas for mentoring sessions. Mentoring not only benefits a child, but can also help the mentor increase their leadership and communication skills. Both mentors and students in the Lanterns Program find much joy in the positive relationships formed.

AHM's Prevention Programming promotes awareness of and education about substance and alcohol use among our youth with initiatives designed to reduce occurrence. School-Based Support Services

AHM provides school-based student support services for elementary, middle, and high school students. A Student Support Services Counselor (SSSC) is located within the school, and can be easily accessed by students for a variety of needs. Services include individual counseling, group counseling, risk assessment, crisis intervention, classroom/teacher support, parent support, referrals to outside services, peer mediation, and positive youth development programming.

Student Support Services Counselors are master's level therapists or school counselors who are professionals in the field of mental health. They are skilled in identifying a child's needs, collaborating with school staff and parents, and offering interventions designed to support each student's success. Our counselors are also active in the Juvenile Review Board, as well as on-going positive youth programming such as Power of Words, Peer Helpers, Freshman Orientation, Girl Power Camp, among others.
