



PARADE ROUTE, JUDGING & AWARDS The parade starts at the dam and proceeds
counterclockwise around the lake. Gather at

3:50 pm. The parade starts when the judge's boat at the dam blows its fog horn. The theme for the 2023 parade is ~ `LET FREEDOM RING'. Be creative, yet safe, in decorating boats related to the theme. Judges are on shore and on the water. Awards will be given in the following categories: Most Spirited, Most Decorated, Best Representing the Theme, Land Recognition Decorations.

ASSESSORS OFFICE: The Renter's Relief program will begin April 1 and will run through October 1st. You will need proof of rent payments and utilities paid in the 2020 calendar year.

MOTOR VEHICLE ADJUSTMENTS

In order to have a motor vehicle bill adjusted we need two forms of proof because the tax is a car tax not a road tax.

- The first is a copy of your motor vehicle plate return receipt
- The second is something proving you got rid of the vehicle. For a list of accepted proofs
 look on the assessor's website or call the office.
- If you traded a vehicle and kept the same plate do not bring us any documentation because DMV will automatically process the adjustments.

The Assessor's Office is open Monday through Wednesday from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m., Thursdays 8 a.m. until 6 p.m. and Fridays 8 a.m. until Noon. Our telephone number is 228-9555.



Digital Divide program

A collaboration between the Department of Aging & Disability Services (ADS) State Unit on Aging & the CT Tech Act Project (CTTAP).



This 2 year pilot program allows us to have a Full Time *Digital Divide Coordinators (DDC)* at two of our community AT Partner agencies: the NEAT Center at Oak Hill & UCP of Eastern CT. Our goal is to help bridge the digital divide by providing one on one or group services to adults with disabilities (18 and older) and aging adults (60 and older).

Services to individuals include:

- Increase access to technology & technology use
- Provide tech support, troubleshooting, & teach built in device accessibility features
- Increase access to the community, virtual programming & telehealth to reduce social isolation
- Connect Individuals to community resources for ongoing supports
- Provide tablet technology (with or without hotspot) to individuals 60 & older, if eligible

Why connect with a DDC?

If you or an individual you work with has technology but struggles to use it and would benefit from some training & support, such as

- · Connecting to their Wi Fi
- · Learning to use social media to connect to family and friends
- · Learning to use virtual platforms like Zoom, Teams or virtual community services
- Learning how to use built in accessibility features in their devices speech to text, magnification, text to





MARINE PATROL: The mission of the Marine Patrol Unit is to promote safe and recreational boating on Columbia lake by conducting regular safety inspections of recreational vessels.

Inspections are completed to ensure proper safety equipment, compliance with boating regulations and licensing and to educate boaters while promoting safety on the water. The marine Patrol is observant of boating violations that hold the potential to cause a hazard or danger to others using the water.



NEW TENNIS/PICKLE BALL COURTS ARE COMPLETE! The Newly constructed pickle-ball courts and tennis court are now playable! Please keep in mind the following 'Rules of the Court'.

- 1. Please be respectful to the courts, facilities and all patrons.
- 2. The pickle-ball courts located within the tennis court are overflow courts that can be utilized when the tennis court is unoccupied. If tennis players arrive while a pickle-ball game is in progress, the PB players may finish their game to no more than 9 points (no winning by 2) then must vacate the court.
- 3. When the available pickle-ball courts are fully occupied and people are waiting to play, racquet's should be lined up to determine who plays next.



4. When there are four or more people waiting to play, all four players on a court must exit and place their racquet's at the end of the line at the conclusion of their game. (No "winners stay on" when four others are waiting to play.)

TAX DEPARTMENT: Tax bills for the 2022 Grand List were mailed on June 28, 2023 with a due date of July 1, 2023. The last day to pay without a penalty will be Tuesday, August 1, 2023. Bills will be available online on July 1, 2023. Failure to receive a bill does not invalidate the tax or interest per CT State Statute. If you have not received your tax bills, please contact the tax office at 860-228-0230 or taxcollector@columbiact.org.

If you are coming to pay in person in July and on August 1, 2023, please be aware that there may be a line and you may have to wait for service. Please plan your visit accordingly.

Property taxes on the Grand List of 10/1/2022 will become due and payable July 1, 2023. Real estate and personal property taxes (other than registered motor vehicles) may be paid in two installments if the total tax due is over \$250.00. The second installment of these taxes will become due Jan 1, 2024. All Motor Vehicle taxes, the first installment of Real Estate and Personal Property taxes will become delinquent on August 2, 2023.

Mail must be postmarked on or before August 1, 2023 to be considered paid on-time. By law this office uses the USPS postmark as the payment date. If you are waiting until the last few days to pay, it is recommended that you have your envelope hand stamped in the Post Office. Putting your envelope in a blue postal box may not guarantee an on-time postmark.

If taxes are not paid on or before Aug 1, 2023, interest is charged at the rate of 1.5% per month (18% per year) from the due date of July 1st. On August 2nd the interest will be 3% (1.5% for July and 1.5 % for August). The minimum interest charge is \$2.00 (per vehicle).

Taxes may be paid by mail or put in one of the drop boxes outside of the Town Hall; or online via www.columbiact.org and service fees apply. The Tax Collector's office hours in the Town Hall, 323 RT 87 Columbia in July & Aug 1st are MON through WED 8AM to 4PM, THURS 10AM to 6PM and FRI 8AM to 12PM.

You will need to provide the proper proof to the Assessor's office for any adjustments to the bill.

DOG LICENSING: JUNE began dog licensing month.

The license year for your dog runs from July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. When licensing your dog, if their rabies vaccination has expired, please provide us with a copy of their current rabies vaccination certificate. If your dog has been spayed or neutered, include a copy of the veterinarian's certificate as well.

Please note: If you are licensing your dog(s) in July, there is now a \$1.00 late fee per dog.
