Hazardous materials must be taken to the MidNEROC Household Chemical Waste Drop-Off Facility located on Hancock Road in Willington. There is no charge for the use of this facility by Willington residents, with proof of residency. Business will be charged based on the material type and quantity. Call (684) 3163 to make arrangements.

## ACCEPTED MATERIALS

### From the House

- Drain Cleaners
- Metal Polish
- Arts & Crafts Supplies
- Aerosol Cans with Hazardous Waste Content
- Household Batteries
- Oven Cleaners
- Photo Chemicals
- Floor Cleaners
- Mercury Thermometers

### From the Garage

- Fire Starters
- Old Chemistry Kits
- Transmission Fluid
- Engine & Radiator Flushes
- Contaminated Gasoline, Kerosene
- Waxes, Polishes

## ACCEPTED MATERIALS

### From the Workbench

- Rust Preventative
- Wood Preservatives
- Oil-based Paints
- Paint Thinners
- Solvents
- Wood Strippers
- Lead-based Paints
- Degreasers

### From the Yard/Garden

- Pesticides
- Herbicides
- Rodent Killers
- Muriatic Acid
- Pesticides or Herbicides with 2,4,5-T or Silvex
- Cesspool Cleaners
- Fertilizers
- Insect Sprays
- Pool Chemicals

## MATERIALS NOT ACCEPTED

### Latex Paint:

Dry out the paint in the can by adding sawdust or kitty litter and dispose with trash.

### Asbestos:

Double bag and seal. One cubic foot can be disposed with trash. For large quantities, contact an asbestos removal company listed in the yellow pages.

**Car Batteries, Transmission Oil, #2 Fuel Oil, Motor Oil, Brake Fluid, Gas Cylinders, Diesel Fuel, Anti-freeze and Kerosene:**

Recycled through your town.

### Gas Cylinders - Refillable Type

Return to the company that distributed them.

### Explosives, Fireworks, Ammunition:

Contact your state police barracks.

### Water Reactive Materials and Chemicals such as peroxides and metallic sodium :

Contact your local fire marshal for proper disposal.

### Biologically Active Materials:

Usually pathological matter.

Contact Conn. DEP Hazardous Waste Division at 424-3372.

### Medication:

Usually can be disposed of with trash. Contact Conn. Dept. of Health Services at 566-3186.

### Unknown Material

Contact Conn. DEP Waste Bureau at 424-3366.

## LIMITATIONS

- Up to 10 gallons liquid (1 gallon or less of each material) and 100 pounds dry material.
- Bring proof of residency.
- No commercial users.

## HOW TO PREPARE MATERIALS

- Pack carefully in original containers only, sealed and labeled.
- Do not mix materials.
- Place carefully in the car, prevent tipping.
- Drive carefully. Do not smoke while handling and transporting materials.

## CHEMICAL WASTE IS A PROBLEM

When hazardous wastes are poured down the sink or toilet, dumped "out back," poured into a street drain or put out in the trash, they eventually make their way into our water supply.



*Wherever you live, you live within a watershed. Streams lead into rivers and bodies of water. In CT we live in the Long Island Sound Watershed. Pouring certain chemical products down the drain, dumping excess products*

*such as waste oil and gasoline on the ground, or overuse of pesticides and fertilizers can threaten nearby sources of drinking water and the Sound.*
